

PROMINENT MATZOH BAKER DIES.

Hyman Wittenberg, prominent Chicago matzoh baker, died Wednesday, August 16, at the Presbyterian hospital. He was fifty-five years old. Mr. Wittenberg, who lived at 1214 South Kedzie avenue, was known throughout the community for his contributions to charitable institutions. For thirty-six years he was connected with the firm of Farber and Wittenberg, matzoh bakers, and through these years he has been supplying the Marks Nathan Orphan home and the Old People's home with bread and matzoh.

He has perpetuated the general respect in which the community held him by leaving at the disposal of James Davis of the Federated Orthodox Jewish Charities \$3,000, which Mr. Davis is to distribute among the following organizations: the Marks Nathan Jewish Orphan home, the Old People's home, the Jewish Day and Night Nursery, the Federated Orthodox Jewish Charities, Mt. Sinai hospital, and the Anshe Knesses Israel synagogue at 3411 Douglas boulevard, of which Mr. Wittenberg was a member.

Mr. Wittenberg leaves seven children: Max H., Mrs. Chas. Edelman, Mrs. Samuel Greenspahn and Milton, Margaret, Irving, and Jeanette Wittenberg. The funeral was held Friday, August 18, from the Anshe Knesses Israel synagogue to Waldheim.
